Spring Break Essentials

Whether you're planning on a beach trip, road trip, or stay-cation this Spring Break, here are a few basics everyone should travel with to keep your skin healthy when out on the road.

First and foremost, this may seem obvious, but it is essential to protect your skin. While we all know a sunburn is an easy way to ruin a trip, even tanning is actually the result of UV induced injury to the skin. In other words, there is no such thing as a healthy tan. It is important to remember that we need to be more cautious during the first sun exposure after a long winter and little exposure to UV rays.

Some protection pearls include

minimizing sun exposure between the hours of 10am and 2pm, wearing darker colored protective clothing, large brim hats, UV protected sunglasses, and of course sunscreen with an SPF of 50 or higher. If you are planning on spending a large amount of time driving this spring break, make sure

to wear your 50 SPF in the car as UVA rays can penetrate glass windows and damage the skin.

While packing for vacation can be a challenge, I recommend a few products that should be in any suitcase to keep your skin healthy and flawless.

First off, you want to pack your own products to avoid irritating and fragrant substances, often found in hotels, as they can be highly allergenic and cause phototoxic reactions.

Zinc and titanium sunblocks are physical sunscreens as opposed to chemical sunscreens. This essentially means they work by reflecting the sun's rays as opposed to absorbing them. Only mineral sunblocks should be used as these are also fafe for children and adults.

Last but not least, a healthy diet is vital in association with break

outs for our acne prone patients. As many people are hitting the gym in preparation for "bathing suit" weather, make sure to avoid the use of whey protein as it worsens hormonally driven acne. Switching to a plant based protein is recommended.

Additionally, milk also contains high levels of hormones, with skim milk being the worst culprit, and should be limited to one glass per day or less but make sure it is organic.

While difficult to do on spring break, other foods and drinks that are linked with acne include beer, sweats, and chocolate.

Overall, eating a healthy diet, reducing stress, staying really well hydrated, and protecting the skin during spring break will provide you with all the key ingredients to have an awesome time.





April is *Rosacea* Awareness Month

If red pimples and bumps begin to erupt on your nose and the middle of your cheeks in your 20s, you may need treatment for rosacea. This is an inflammation that affects the middle of your face. It can also appear on the forehead and around the mouth.

Flushing is a very common characteristic of rosacea sufferers. Certain foods, heat, alcohol and exercise can aggravate and bring on rosacea. It can affect the face, scalp, back and chest.

There are other conditions that can be mistaken for rosacea. You may think that these pimples, pustules and cysts are just an adult outbreak of acne but rosacea does not in

> itself give rise to blackheads which are a characteristic feature of acne. To add to the confusion, you may hear your physician referring to your condition as "acne rosacea"!

Causes

The exact cause of rosacea is not clear, although it does tend to run in families, which suggests a genetic link. It is also thought that the body's immune response to certain stimulae plays a part.

What we do know is that exposure to certain things can help bring on a bout of rosacea. Some food and drink can aggravate the condition, particularly spicy food and alcohol, but sufferers will show different levels of sensitivity as well.

Treatment

While there are many prescription treatments used to control rosacea, there is no known cure. Prescription antibiotics control the inflammation. Our skin experts at Trillium Creek Dermatology & Surgery use the latest techniques, such as Intense Pulsed Light (IPL), Aerolase, to erase the blood vessels in rosacea and clear the bumps.



Erythematotelangiectatic Rosacea

Flushing, persistent redness and visible blood vessels.



Papulopustular Rosacea

Redness, swelling, and transient bumps and pimples.



Phymatous Rosacea

Skin thickening, often resulting in an enlargement of the nose.



Ocular Rosacea

Eye irritation such as blood-shot eyes that feel gritty.

How to Prevent Skin Conditions in

Athletes are at an increased risk of skin infections, which can have serious consequences. To Athletes

help prevent infections, athletes, parents, coaches, and athletic trainers can follow these tips from dermatologists:



Keep cuts and scrapes clean and covered with a bandage until healed. A cut or scrape weakens the skin's defense and allows germs that cause infections to enter.

Prevent blisters to

reduce infections. Apply a pad, gel, or spray to areas that routinely blister. To help prevent blisters on the feet, ankles and hands, consider using specialized gloves and socks or wearing two pairs of socks. Athletes should also make sure that their footwear fits properly.

Wear moisture-wicking clothes. This helps keep

the athlete's skin dry and prevents germs from growing. Wear sandals in the locker room. Wearing sandals or other shoes helps reduce infections on the feet.

Shower after every practice and game. In

addition, athletes should use an antimicrobial soap and wash their entire body.

Do not share personal care items. Athletes should always use a clean towel after showering and use their own towels, soaps, razors and other personal care items.

Wash clothes and towels after each use. Sports

bags should also be washed, as germs that cause infections can remain in the bags and grow. Disinfect equipment, including protective gear, daily. For proper disinfection, follow the manufacturers' instructions.

Perform regular skin

checks. Athletes should check their skin daily, especially those in high-risk sports, such as wrestling. Look for any changes, such as cuts, sores, redness, swelling and pus, and report any changes to your dermatologist

Without treatment, skin infections can worsen. If you or your athletes notice anything on their skin that itches, burns or is infected, make an appointment today! What to Look For In Your Cleaning Supplies:

Hand Soap


Look for hand soap that is antibacterial, as they are more effective than regular soap for killing germs.

Example: Dial & Zest

Laundry Detergent

Look for products that are dye-free and perfume-free. These are great for everyone, but especially for those who have skin conditions such as eczema, psoriasis, or extremely dry skin.

Example: Tide Free & Gentle or Purex Free & Clear





What is a WART?

Warts are non-cancerous skin growths caused by the human papilloma virus (HPV). They are common around the nails, back of the hand and soles of the feet. Warts can be raised and rough, flat and scaly or long and narrow, depending on their type and location on the skin.



Cryotherapy

Involves freezing a wart using liquid nitrogen




Chemical

Salicylic or lactic acid removes the wart by exfoliating the skin cells until the wart is gone



Electrodessication

Uses an electrical current to burn and scrape away the surface of the wart



Laser

Laser destroys the root of the wart, avoiding tissue damage or scarring

5 Things to look for in a **Dermatologist**

Dermatologists are speciallytrained experts who diagnose and treat a variety of skin, hair and nail diseases. Dermatologist rely on their training to identify specific skin conditions and recommend the best course of treatment for each patient.

If you have yet to visit a skin expert, here's a refresher on what exactly a dermatologist is. In addition to skin treatments, a dermatologist can recommend cosmetic procedures which enhance or correct the process of aging, scars or other face and body issues.

When researching for your dermatologist, keep these 5 things in mind:

Certifications: Board certified is an important label to look for in finding any expert. This tells you the specialist has completed the training and mastered the skills necessary in his or her field. Research the facilities as well:

Whether in a clinic or hospital setting or private practice, the conditions of your dermatologist's office are a reflection of the specialist. If the materials available for reading/research are dated, dirty or unprofessional in any way, that can be an indication of the level of current research available at this facility.

Consider gender: This is more important than you might think. You need to be open, honest and able to communicate with your dermatologist. If you'd prefer to open up to someone of the same gender or are uncomfortable showing certain body parts to someone of the opposite gender, you should consider that aspect.

Stress-free appointments and scheduling procedures:

Excellent dermatologists don't watch their clock when with patients. You want a specialist

that evaluates your health concerns and makes use of your appointment time efficiently but thoroughly. If you have difficulty making an appointment and are rushed through the entire process, this might not be the dermatologist for you.

A great Q&A session: You want a dermatologist you can talk to. Come prepared to discuss anything and everything that is of concern to your skin, hair and/or nails. During this initial consultation, you want your skin expert to answer and validate your questions and concerns. If you are considering a cosmetic procedure, here are some great questions to start with. Skin conditions can be stressful and that can increase the severity of outbreaks, depending on the condition. You want a dermatologist that is helpful in regaining your confidence and self-esteem but is also highly skilled. Dermatologists have access to a wider variety of prescription medicines and treatments than your regular primary care physician.




